

TEDDY ROCKS FESTIVAL LTD [TRF]
2027 LIVE-IN VEHICLE TERMS & CONDITIONS

1. Access and use of the live-in vehicle is subject to the Teddy Rocks Festival General Terms and Conditions and the Teddy Rocks Festival Camping terms and conditions as well as the terms and conditions listed below. These can be downloaded from www.teddyrocks.co.uk/terms and www.teddyrocks.co.uk/camping respectively. Purchasing a live-in vehicle ticket constitutes your acceptance of all T&C'S.
2. A supplemental Live-in Vehicle Ticket must be purchased for anyone wishing to camp on site in a live-in vehicle. By that we mean any campervan, motorhome, caravan or trailer tent specifically designed for camping. [See definition below]. The campervan ticket will be issued with a window pass that must be on display on site at all times within the live-in vehicle.
3. All persons who will be camping in the live-in vehicle field must also be in possession of a full weekend camping festival ticket. Day tickets are not acceptable nor are weekend only tickets. The live-in vehicle ticket alone does not gain you entry to the festival.
4. Pitches in the live-in vehicle field measure 7m x 7m. This is adequate space for your live-in vehicle plus one of the following:
 - 4.1. An extendable awning or gazebo
 - 4.2. The vehicle used to tow your caravan/trailer tent.
 - 4.3. A single tent to be used by the family or group within the live-in vehicle.
5. There is only one live-in vehicle per pitch.
6. Once your live-in vehicle or your towing vehicle are parked, they will not be permitted to move until you are leaving the site for good. If you wish to use your towing vehicle to leave then come back to site, it must be parked in the car park and possess a car park pass which will need to be purchased separately.

7. Live-in Vehicle Definition:

A vehicle that has been designed to have an inbuilt bed, inbuilt water storage tank, inbuilt cooking facilities. We will strictly not accept "makeshift" live-in vehicles i.e., no vans or people carriers etc. with mattresses or portable cookers inside. If in doubt, contact the festival with a photo of your vehicle. Contact details can be found on our website. Any vehicle trying to pass as a campervan and deemed inappropriate by the campsite security crew, will be turned away with no refund of any of the tickets. Roof/tent box type accessories are allowed and count as a Live-in Vehicle.

8. The live-in vehicle field will have facilities to support you: toilets, access to a water tap, access to waste-water disposal. Note that this is waste-water from washing or cooking – not toilet waste. Showers will be located in the tent camping field, a short walk for ticketholders staying in the caravan / campervan campsite. A separate shower pass will be required for those wishing to use them <https://www.teddyrocks.co.uk/tickets>
9. There are no generators allowed in the campsite. If found, the generator will be confiscated and not returned until you leave the site. Likewise, there are to be NO freestanding LPG canisters other than those fitted for use within campervan or caravan.
10. As with all of the camping fields, there are to be no open fires: no chimneys, braziers, fire pits, campfires etc. If found, the item will be confiscated and not

returned until you leave the site. Throwing gas, aerosol or similar canisters/containers on to fires is extremely dangerous and will lead to eviction.

11. There will be marked fire lanes within the live-in vehicle field. Please do not park or block these lanes in any way.
12. Your pitch should allow you all the room you need. Any vehicle or item that is found in the fire lanes will be asked to move or will be moved.
13. Vehicles and tents may be searched on entry by security staff to ensure no prohibited items are brought on to site as specified in the Camping T & C's. Security staff will confiscate such items and may refuse entry to the site. The discretion and decision of the security team will be final.
14. All vehicles and belongings must be removed from the site by midday on the Monday at the end of the festival.
15. Any items or vehicles left on the Campervan/ Caravan field will be removed and we reserve the right to charge any costs incurred in its removal to the customer.
16. Please respect the farmland we are using by not dumping waste, leaving litter or using anything other than the toilets provided. To do so may endanger the land or any of the farm animals that use the land.

Uneven Terrain:

1. Please be aware that the festival is held on a farm with natural, uneven terrain. Attendees should exercise caution while walking around the festival grounds, as surfaces may be irregular and include natural obstructions such as rocks, roots, and slopes.
2. ****Personal Responsibility****: Visitors attend the festival at their own risk. It is the responsibility of each attendee to take appropriate care while moving through the site, including wearing suitable footwear and remaining aware of their surroundings.
3. * ***Assumption of Risk****: By attending the festival, you acknowledge the inherent risks associated with outdoor activities on uneven terrain and agree to hold the festival organisers harmless from any injuries or damages that may occur.
4. * ***Health and Safety Advice****: We recommend all attendees wear appropriate attire for an outdoor setting. Please stay hydrated, use sun protection, and be prepared for changes in weather conditions.
5. ****Emergency Services****: In case of an injury or emergency, please contact festival staff immediately. First aid services will be available on site.
6. ****Children and Vulnerable Persons****: Please ensure that children and individuals who may need assistance are supervised at all times and are made aware of potential hazards.

By entering the festival grounds, you acknowledge that you have read and understood this disclaimer and agree to adhere to the festival's terms and conditions.

Zero Tolerance Drug Policy - Teddy Rocks Festival

1. Purpose

Our festival is designed to be a safe, inclusive, and family-friendly environment for people of all ages. This policy outlines our strict prohibition of illegal drugs to protect the wellbeing of children, families, and all attendees.

2. Scope

This policy applies to everyone on-site, including attendees, families, staff, volunteers, performers, vendors, and contractors.

3. Policy Statement

We operate a zero tolerance policy towards illegal drugs. The possession, use, or distribution of controlled substances is strictly prohibited anywhere within the festival grounds.

This includes substances controlled under the Misuse of Drugs Act 1971 and the Psychoactive Substances Act 2016.

4. Our Commitment to a Family-Friendly Environment

We are committed to creating a welcoming space where:

- Children and young people can safely enjoy activities
- Families feel comfortable and secure
- All attendees can relax without exposure to illegal or harmful substances

5. Prohibited Activities

The following are not permitted:

- Possession of illegal drugs
- Use or attempted use of illegal drugs
- Supplying or sharing drugs with others
- Possession of items intended for illegal drug use

6. Safety and Security Measures

To maintain a safe environment for families, we may implement:

- Bag and personal searches at entry points
- Visible and approachable security staff
- Use of detection methods, including sniffer dogs where appropriate
- Monitoring of festival areas to ensure compliance, including surveillance systems such as CCTV
- Security patrols throughout the site

All measures are conducted respectfully and with consideration for families and children.

7. Consequences of Breach

Anyone found in breach of this policy may be subject to:

- Confiscation of substances
- Immediate removal from the festival without refund
- Involvement of police where necessary
- Restrictions on attending future events

8. Welfare and Support

The safety of our guests is our priority. On-site medical and welfare teams are available at all times. Anyone needing help—whether for themselves or someone else—should approach staff immediately. Seeking medical assistance will always be treated as a priority.

9. Working Together

We encourage all attendees to:

- Look out for one another
- Report concerns to staff promptly
- Help us maintain a positive and safe environment for children and families

10. Communication

This policy is shared through:

- Ticket terms and conditions
- Festival website and pre-event information
- Signage throughout the site

11. Review

We regularly review this policy to ensure it supports a safe, enjoyable, and family-focused experience for all.
